WHEREAS, it is now necessary to further modify and redefine the Committee's purpose, membership, and organization,

IT IS ORDERED that the attached policies are adopted to govern the purpose, membership and structure of the Committee on Court Automation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order rescinds and replaces Administrative Orders 95-3, 98-7, 98-9 and 99-13.

MOHAVE COUNTY COURT SYSTEM

POLICIES OF THE COMMITTEE ON AUTOMATION

- A. General Purpose The Committee on Automation shall:
 - 1. Oversee administration of the Court Automation Enterprise Fund as set forth in certain intergovernmental agreements between the Mohave County Board of Supervisors and the Cities of Bullhead City, Kingman, and Lake Havasu City.
 - 2. Authorize the purchase, installation, and maintenance of hardware, software and related technology required for court automation and for professional services as may be required for the efficient installation, operation, and management of the project consistent with Mohave County budgetary policies and procedures.
 - 3. Pursue funding of equipment and software modification and/or enhancements for the court automation system through Federal and State grants or monies that may otherwise be available including but not limited to Arizona Supreme Court Judicial Collection Enhancement Funds (JCEF).
- B. Membership The Committee shall have (13) members all appointed by the Presiding Judge; a Chairman who shall be the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court; Mohave County Manager; Superior Court Administrator; Mohave County Finance Director; Court Automation Systems Manager; Mohave County Information Technology Director; Superior Court Associate Presiding Judge; Presiding Limited Jurisdiction Courts Judge; Municipal Court Magistrate or designee from each participating city; and two (2) public members.
- C. Terms of Members Committee members shall serve such terms as identified in the Memorandum of Understanding between the Mohave County Board of Supervisors and Mohave County Superior Court Presiding Judge or as otherwise determined by the Presiding Judge.
- D. Responsibilities of Members Committee members shall actively participate in committee meetings, administration of committee affairs, and advisory groups as necessary.
- E. Organization The Presiding Judge may appoint advisory groups to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities. A standing advisory group includes the:

1. User Support Group

- a. <u>Purpose</u> The User Support Group will coordinate training issues related to court automation, ensure development of uniform software tables and standardized event codes, establish additional event codes and/or eliminate or revise existing codes based on court needs, resolve daily user issues, discuss and facilitate systemwide software issues, and recommend policy and procedural changes to court practices as related to use of the software application.
- b. <u>Membership</u> The User Support Group shall include representatives from the Mohave County Court System and other justice-related offices as approved by the Presiding Judge.
- c. <u>Organization</u> The User Support Group will be chaired by the Court Automation Systems Manager.
- F. Meetings The Committee on Court Automation shall meet no less than twice a year. The Presiding Judge may call additional meetings as needed.
- G. Actions The Committee shall adopt rules for conducting business. These rules shall prescribe the quorum and majority needed to constitute Committee actions.
- H. Staff The Court Administrator's Office shall provide staff to the Committee and may conduct or coordinate research as recommended by the Committee.
